

2019 ABENY Fall Education Conference Call for Session Proposals

ABENY's Education Committee is now accepting workshop proposals for the Fall 2019 Education Conference Saturday, November 9, 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., at Frederick Douglass Academy, 2581 Adam Clayton Powell Jr. Blvd, Harlem NYC.

The committee welcomes thoughtful, inquiry-focused (question-centered) workshop proposals from members, supporters, and colleagues comprising the ABENY and larger community.

All proposals are due by March 31, 2019.

CONFERENCE OVERVIEW

The primary goal of the ABENY Fall Education Conference is to provide a forum facilitating the exchange of actionable ideas, methodologies, and best practice within the education community that benefit the students, teachers, and Pan-African Diaspora that comprise the ABENY community.

CONFERENCE THEME

The theme of our Fall 2019 conference, "**Cultivating Voices of Empowerment, Advocacy and Social Justice in Education**," focuses on creating an awareness of diverse perspectives in education, and the need for those diverse perspectives to contribute to the success of our students. Combatting the effects of intergenerational poverty, stratified racism, and continued inequities in our schools requires the contribution of many voices and many partners. Teachers, principals, and superintendents cannot ensure success alone. Awareness and activism on the part of the larger community is a key outcome of ABENY's Fall 2019 Education Conference.

OUTCOMES FOCUSED SESSIONS

Session facilitators are the heart of the Fall Education Conference. Instead of lecture-centered sessions in which the presenter's sharing of expertise is the focus, ABENY sessions encourage interaction and peer-to-peer learning, ensuring all participants meaningful opportunities to offer and acquire useful, solution-oriented content.

Sessions are scheduled for 60-minutes and should include small - and/or full-group discussion and provide adequate time for participants to learn from each other through interactive activities.

In the spirit of collaboration, leadership development, and inclusive learning, special consideration will be given to workshop proposals that involve one or more adult learners as co-facilitators.

CONFERENCE STRANDS

Proposed session topics should be structured around the conference theme within one of the following strands:

- Literacy/Pedagogy
- Mental Health/Emotional Intelligence/Trauma
- Civic Awareness and Engagement
- Fine and Performing Arts
- School Integration
- Global Awareness/Readiness (including Financial Literacy/Awareness)
- Family/Community Engagement

SESSION CRITERIA

ABENY's Education Committee welcomes session proposals that meet the following criteria:

- Reflect the Fall 2019 theme: "**Cultivating Voices of Empowerment, Advocacy and Social Justice in Education.**"
- Present content in an interactive and dynamic format through discussion and problem solving, rather than a lecture-based/presenter-centered format;
- Articulate what that audience can expect to gain;
- Use appropriate spelling, capitalization, grammar and punctuation.

Furthermore, the Education Committee will not consider workshops that promote specific commercial products, brands, or institutions. (If you are unsure if your workshop concept falls into one of those categories, please contact the ABENY Education Committee before submitting a proposal.)
